Buses will depart school at 1:30 pm and car riders may be picked up at 1:40 p.m. Please do not park in the bus lanes in front of the school to come inside to get your child. We will follow the regular procedures for pick ups in the afternoons. Students will be brought out to cars as you pull up in the lane. Calendars will be sent home with students that have signed up showing activities and trips planned.
