YOUR WORK IS CRITICAL TO THE EDUCATIONAL SUCCESS OF STUDENTS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS!

- * Recognize common signs of homelessness by:
 - Looking for a history of multiple addresses, or missing documents, particularly those verifying residency
 - Noticing erratic attendance or noticing avoidance of field trips
 - Listening for parent or child statements about staying in multiple locations,
 living at different homes or being in transition
 - o Asking questions in a sensitive and neutral manner
 - o Reviewing Project HOPE-VA's MV101 EC video at www.wm.edu/hope
- Provide a safe, predictable learning environment by:
 - o Creating trauma-sensitive spaces and practices and creating trusting relationships with families and their children through one-on-one time
 - Recognizing that the consistency you provide children through schedules and routines is especially critical for those who lack a stable place to live
 - o Taking the family to a private place to fill out forms or offering to assist with completing forms over the phone if registration has moved online
 - Asking families about access to technology and connectivity in the home and providing information about your program's resources and how to connect to any learning activities being offered
- When you see signs of housing instability, reach out to your homeless liaison who can assist by:
 - Removing barriers to learning related to homelessness
 - Helping families access community services
 - Helping students stay connected to the same school when in their best interest even if they move
